AFA Articulation with NCICUs

- Articulation Agreements approved by SBCC on February 14, 2019 for Music, Theatre, and Visual Arts
- Effective Fall 2019
- For students and NCCCs, essentially the same as the three articulation agreements with UNC System
- A BIG **thank you** to Jenn Selby and the **leadership** of the **NCCC AFA Association** for helping design and move these agreements forward!
- Signing event held at William Peace University on February 28





Associate in Engineering

AE does not currently satisfy UNC lower division general education requirements like the AA and AS

Next Friday, I'll be meeting with the UNC and NCCC Engineering Pathways Group to share a slight change in that degree Curriculum Standard that would meet the GE lower division requirements.

The Curriculum Standard change will go out for a vote to community colleges approved to offer the AE later this month or early April.





Associate in Education/Teaching

- We are working on a Specialized Transfer Degree designed to increase the pipeline of prospective teachers that will permit seamless 2+2 pathways for teacher preparation.
- Dr. Susan Baxter, Division Chair of Education Programs, at Sampson CC is leading this effort.
- The first meeting with five senior partners was held in late February (ECU, UNC-G, WCU, GWU, UMO)
- In March, a meeting with select CC partners will be convened and shortly after that, a combined CC/university meeting will be held to work on a draft for the new degree.



Associate in Education/Teaching (Cont.)

**In late Spring/Early Summer –
Present draft of new degree to CCs and senior institutions for
feedback and refinement with the ultimate goals of:**

1. Developing a new degree for SBCC approval
2. Developing a statewide articulation agreement
3. Designing a CCP Pathway

Likely Fall 2020 effective date for Goals 1-3

4. Working to promote 2+2 “Grow Your Own” teacher preparation programs that will allow students to complete all degree requirements locally (but not exclude traditional transfer pathways to senior institutions)
