Transfer Advisory Committee Minutes

The Transfer Advisory Committee (TAC), the organization which enforces the Comprehensive Articulation Agreement (CAA) posted minutes of their August 23, 2013 meeting. The committee addressed concerns about the CAA revisions, and issues relating to reverse transfer. Discussions centered on a bi-annual review of the implementation of the CAA. It was suggested that, perhaps, an audit of two or more universities would be conducted at each meeting, using rubrics from the audited university, as to how the CAA is implemented at that school.

Michelle Blackwell, director of Reverse Transfer for UNC-GA, reported on progress in the process of Reverse Transfer. Students who transfer to the university without the AA or the AS degree will have their course work from the university transferred back to the community college automatically through a system called DataMart. This work is being funded by the USA Funds.

Beginning in Fall 2013, HIS 122 will no longer carry this designation.
